### **Policy on Moonlighting**

This policy supplements BIDMC PPGD Policy # GME-01 “Duty Hours” and Policy # GME-16 “Trainee Moonlighting.”

Trainees may wish to moonlight outside of the provisions of the fellowship at their own discretion. Residents will be responsible for working with a sponsoring Department within Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, or outside institution, to establish all credentialing and professional liability insurances. Fellows must have an active, unlimited medical license to practice in Massachusetts.

Moonlighting should not interfere with participation in the Clinical Informatics Fellowship Program, nor interfere with project or scholarly activity.

All work related to the fellowship including scholarly and project oriented work, didactics, and clinical moonlighting, but excluding at home reading, may not exceed eighty (80) hours per week.

Trainees must be performing at-level or exceeding expectations on all scholarly activities, projects, and milestones to be eligible for moonlighting. All moonlighting hours must be logged and reported to the program on a monthly basis.

Trainees must request and receive a formal written statement of permission for moonlighting from the program director prior to any moonlighting activity. Adverse effects of moonlighting may lead to withdrawal of permission at the discretion of the Program Director or designee. Suspension of moonlighting privileges include, but are not limited to, failure to meet milestones or failure to meet scholarly activity requirements.
